Singles

Pete started with a match against Norfolk, he got off to a good start and was never behind but only led 8-7 playing the final end. He managed to secure two on the last end to take a 10-7 win.

Next up was a match with Bedfordshire. He made another good start and built an early lead. A poor middle part of the game saw him fall 9-3 behind with two ends to play. A two on the 8th end gave him a chance and a full house on the last end saw him grab a 9-9 draw from the jaws of defeat.

A similar story in his third game against Cambridgeshire. A decent start, followed by a poor middle part of the game and he trailed 9-7 playing the final end. He was only able to gain a single on the last end losing the match 9-8.

A win would be needed in the 4th game to retain any hope of winning the title. Another good start saw him build an early lead, the middle part of the game was better this time as he eased away to a 9-4 win.

Suffolk were the opponents in the final session, if Pete won and Norfolk lost their final game he would take the title. Pete led throughout and established a 7-3 lead playing the final end, where he controlled matters to ensure he didn't drop a full house taking a 7-6 win. The Bedfordshire player (Norfolk's opponent) had kept their match tight and managed to take two shots on the final end to win the game and hand Pete the title.

Pairs

Jason and Jack started their day with a commanding 13-4 win over Norfolk.

They followed that up in their second game with another convincing display, beating the Bedfordshire pair 11-5.

Cambridgeshire were their opponents in their 3rd game. They were made to work a little harder this time but led from start to finish as they eased away to an 8-4 win.

The 4th game against Essex was the crucial one of the day. Both teams had won their first three matches and the winner of this would have one had on the trophy. A close game was expected but that was not the case. Jack and Jason won end after end and eased away to a convincing 13-1 win.

That all but secured the title, with one game to play they held a two point and seventeen shot advantage over Essex.

The final game against Suffolk started perfectly as they picked up a four on the fist end. Their opponents chipped away at that lead but could only reduce the arrears to 7-5 playing the final end. However, there was a sting in the tail as their opponents picked up three on the final end to take the game 8-7.

Triples

Fours

Team
