## Hertfordshire v Suffolk - Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> March 2014

Hertfordshire played their 5<sup>th</sup> and final league game of the season against Suffolk and performed well despite going down to a 21-15 defeat.

Session 1: Two of the tree games started and remained close throughout the match.
